<p>1. What is the name of the Capitol of Sweden? Where is it located?</p>	<p>Stockholm located in Central Sweden on 14 islands in the Baltic Sea, next to lake Mälaren</p>
<p>2. Who is the King of Sweden? The Queen? The Crown Princess?</p>	<p>Carl XVI Gustaf is the King of Sweden, married to Queen Silvia, their oldest child is the Crown Princess Victoria.</p>
<p>3. Name the 3 largest cities in Sweden?</p>	<p>Stockholm - 980,000, Gothenburg (Göteborg) 590,000, Malmö 350,000 residents</p>
<p>4. What is the name of the Prime Minister killed coming out of a theatre? Who was his killer?</p>	<p>(1986) Prime Minister Olof Palme. (1989) Christer Pettersson was arrested but not charged. Stig Engström was main suspect, but the case was closed in 2020 without enough evidence.</p>
<p>5. What Swedish Scientist invented the dynamite? What annual price is named after him.</p>	<p>Alfred Bernhard Nobel (1833-1896) was a Swedish chemist, engineer, inventor, and industrialist best known for inventing dynamite and holding 355 patents. Nobel Prizes</p>
<p>6. What is the currency of Sweden called? What is the approximate exchange rate?</p>	<p>Swedish Krona, (in English Crown). 1 Krona = 100 Öre. About 9 Krona = 1 USD</p>
<p>7. What Swedish diplomat was the Secretary General of United Nations. How did he die?</p>	<p>Dag Hammarskjöld was a Swedish economist, diplomat, and the second Secretary-General of the United Nations from 1953 until his death in a 1961 plane crash during a peace mission in the Congo.</p>

9. What are the colors of the Swedish flag?	The national flag of Sweden (Sveriges flagga) consists of a yellow or gold Nordic cross on a field of light blue used since 1275 current design adopted in 1906
10. What do all Scandinavian (Nordic countries) flags have in common?	The Nordic Cross , the cross represents Christianity first seen national flag of Denmark in the 13th century.
